# Cambia Economic Contributions

A look at the 2016 effects of Cambia Health Solutions on the economies of Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and Utah



# **Key Findings**

### Introduction

Cambia Health Solutions, a taxpaying nonprofit health solutions company based in the Pacific Northwest, retained ECONorthwest to evaluate how its business operations and employees contributed to the regional economy. The economic effects of Cambia's business operations, charitable contributions, and capital spending rippled through the economies of Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and Utah, supporting additional activities in other parts of the economy through the purchase of goods and services from local businesses and household spending by employees. The report examines each of these contributions in greater detail.

### **Economic Output**



In 2016, across Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and Utah, Cambia supported:

- \$1.2 billion in economic activity
- 9,100 jobs
- \$521.1 million in labor income

Every \$1 million dollars spent by Cambia supported an additional \$700,000 of economic activity across the region.

# **Spending**



Cambia spent \$728.3 million on operations spending, taxes, charitable giving, and payroll in 2016. Approximately 65 percent of total operations expenditures, or \$474.5 million, were spent at businesses and organizations in the four-state region.

### **Taxes**



As a taxpaying nonprofit, Cambia paid \$50.4 million in taxes to local and state governments across the fourstate region. Cambia also paid \$150.2 million in federal income and insurer taxes.

### **Charitable Giving**



Cambia, its employees, and its grant-making Foundation gave \$10.3 million to nonprofits and charities across the four-state region. Cambia employees also donated 8,441 hours to nonprofits and charities.

#### The Cambia Grove

Though its economic and fiscal impacts are not analyzed in this report, the significance of the Cambia Grove as an innovative health care-focused hub in Seattle, Washington, merits special mention. The Cambia Grove serves the region by convening leadership and catalyzing continuous innovation in health care. One of its initial efforts was a 2015 collaboration with the Washington State Department of Commerce. ECONorthwest quantified the significance of the state's Health Care Innovation Sub-sector, and found that health care innovation work drives

growth for Washington state's economy and accounts for jobs in 25 of the state's 39 counties, with workers generating \$3.42 of output for every \$1 of income.

#### Cambia Foundation

Cambia's separate, 501(c)(3) grant-making organization was established in 2007. Cambia Health Foundation's mission is to invest in partnerships and initiatives that move health care from innovation to impact, through a focus on three program areas: advancing palliative care through its signature program, Sojourns; improving children's mental and behavioral health; and promoting health care equity, quality and innovation. Since 2009, the Foundation has funded \$47 million in grants to support these causes.

# Defining Economic Contributions

ECONorthwest worked with Cambia to obtain the necessary financial data required to perform the economic contributions analysis, including operations spending, payroll, and capital expenditures. To evaluate the economic contributions of Cambia, ECONorthwest used IMPLAN, an input-output model which enables users to follow expenditures from a company as they flow through a region's economy. For this analysis, ECONorthwest modeled the effects of Cambia's operations in Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and Utah.

Economic contributions analyses employ specific terminology to identify different types of economic effects that can be modeled using input-output tools.

- **Direct effects** are those associated with payroll and employment at Cambia. They also include the direct output of Cambia's activities.
- **Indirect effects** represent Cambia's purchase of goods and services from other businesses in the region, also known as supply chain effects. These businesses, in turn, purchase intermediate goods and services from other businesses in the region, generating subsequent rounds of activity (or, the "multiplier effect").

**Induced effects** are generated through spending associated with payroll from Cambia and supported industries in the supply chain. These induced effects from payroll spending are often referred to as "consumption-driven" effects.

Taken together, these combined economic effects describe how Cambia's operations support the demand for local resources and commodities that are, in turn, supplied by local and non-local industries and households.



**Output** represents the total value of goods and services produced. This is the largest, most encompassing measure of economic activity and includes personal income.



Personal Income consists of total payroll costs (including bonuses and benefits) paid to workers, as well as selfemployment income earned by individuals.



**Jobs** represent the number of people working full- or part-time jobs in terms of full-yearequivalents (FYE).



# Cambia's Workforce

Cambia employs 5,584 people across Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and Utah. As we show in the map below, Cambia's employees also reside in communities across the four-state region. This dispersion of employees helps distribute the effects of household spending to many communities throughout the region.

# Cambia's Total Contributions

The combined economic effects of Cambia's business operations, charitable contributions, and capital spending support economic activity across Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and Utah. These regional expenditures support activities in other parts of the economy through the purchase of goods and services from local businesses. Additionally, Cambia employees help support the regional economy through household spending on consumer goods and services.

Spending. Cambia's operations spending, including charitable contributions and payroll, amounted to \$728.3 million in 2016. Approximately 65 percent of total operations expenditures, or \$474.5 million, were spent at businesses and organizations in the four states.

**Economic Output.** Output represents the total value of all sales and other operating income occurring in the study area, including supply chain purchases and compensation of employees. Across the four-state region, Cambia supported \$1.2 billion in gross economic activity.

Jobs and Income. Cambia provided 5,584 family-wage jobs across Oregon, Washington, Idaho, and Utah and supported a total of 9,100 jobs. Each job provided by Cambia supported (through consumption spending) 1.5 additional jobs in the region.

Total Output by State, 2016




# **Economic Effects of Operations**

The approach we used to measure the economic contributions of Cambia's operations relies on detailed vendor and payroll expenses. Cambia provided detail operating costs for 2016, which included industry and geographic information about the spending. With this information, we were able to build a custom production function (or spending pattern) of their operations in each of the four states. In 2016, Cambia spent \$728.3 million on operations, which supported \$1.1 billion in gross economic activity across the region.

# **Economic Effects of Capital** Expenditures

In instances where a company has ongoing operations and conducts a capital expansion project, the capital project represents an alternative or tangential activity. These are expenditures that are used to expand or upgrade physical assets. In 2016, Cambia spent \$50.8 million on capital investments, which supported an additional \$27 million in economic activity for the region. This amounted to \$77.9 million in total output from capital expenditures across the four-state region.



# Fiscal Effects

In addition to economic contributions, ECONorthwest measured the fiscal contributions of the additional economic activity generated from Cambia's spending in the region. Strictly speaking, fiscal contributions are not economic contributions, but the analyses often go hand in hand. Economic contributions analysis describes how that spending affects the region in terms of jobs, income, and gross regional product.

The *fiscal* contributions analysis refers to specific tax revenues for affected units of government. In 2016, as a taxable nonprofit, Cambia directly spent \$150.2 million in federal income and insurer taxes, and \$50.4 million on taxes in the four-state region. Their economic activity that year supported an additional \$22.4 million through local business purchases and payroll taxes.

# **Economic Effects of Charitable Giving**

Cambia's economic contribution in the fourstate region includes providing \$10.3 million to nonprofits, foundations, and charities. The recipients of these charitable expenditures use that money to purchase labor, goods, and services that support their respective organizations. Contribution to charitable organizations supports indirect and induced economic activity in the nonprofit sectors.



# **Oregon Contributions**



Cambia Health Solutions is headquartered in Portland, Oregon. Cambia's regional health plan is the state's largest nonprofit health insurance company, serving more than 755,000 members in Oregon. In addition to providing health insurance coverage, Cambia also invests in innovative businesses.

### **Output**

Output represents the total value of all sales and other operating income occurring in Oregon, including taxes, supply chain purchases, and compensation of employees. After accounting for supply chain and consumption effects, Cambia supported \$697.8 million in total gross economic activity in 2016.

### **Spending**

Cambia's operations spending in Oregon amounted to \$426.1 million in 2016 (including taxes). Approximately 55 percent of total operations expenditures—about \$235 million—were spent at businesses and organizations in Oregon.

# Washington Contributions



Cambia's regional health plan provides health insurance for more than 1 million people across Washington. Additionally, Cambia has launched Cambia Grove in Seattle, which brings entrepreneurs and innovators together with anchor partners to transform the health care sector.

### Output

Output represents the total value of all sales and other operating income occurring in Washington, including taxes, supply chain purchases, and compensation of employees. After accounting for supply chain and consumption effects, Cambia supported \$377.9 million in total gross economic activity in 2016.

### **Spending**

Cambia's operations spending in Washington amounted to \$221.6 million in 2016 (including taxes). Approximately 77 percent of total operations and capital expenditures—about \$170.6 million—were directly spent directly in Washington.

Cambia supported a total of 3,162 family-wage jobs across Washington and \$178 million in labor income. Each direct Cambia job supported 1.4 additional jobs in the state.

# **Idaho Contributions**



Founded in 1946, Cambia's regional health plan affiliate is a leader in Idaho's health insurance industry. Regional health plan operations in Idaho provide coverage to more than 140,000 members across the state, and in Asotin and Garfield counties in Washington.

Output represents the total value of all sales and other operating income occurring in Idaho, including taxes, supply chain purchases, and compensation of employees. After accounting for supply chain and consumption effects, Idaho supported \$68.3 million in total gross economic activity in 2016.

Cambia's capital investment and operations spending in Idaho amounted to \$43.3 million in 2016 (including taxes). Approximately 83.1 percent of total operations and capital expenditures—about \$36 million—were spent locally in Idaho.

Cambia supported a total of 766 family-wage jobs across Idaho and \$33.9 million in labor income. Each direct Cambia job supported 1.4 additional jobs in the state.

# **Utah Contributions**

Founded in 1944 as the state's first health insurer, Cambia's regional health plan is a leader in the state's insurance industry, providing coverage for more than 490,000 members across the state.

Output represents the total value of all sales and other operating income occurring in Utah, including taxes, supply chain purchases, and compensation of employees. After accounting for supply chain and consumption effects, Cambia supported \$83.5 million in total gross economic activity in 2016.

### **Spending**

Cambia's capital investment and operations spending in Utah amounted to \$37.3 million in 2016 (including taxes). Approximately 89.3 percent of total operations and capital expenditures about \$33.3 million—were directly spent locally in Utah.

Cambia supported a total of 673 family-wage jobs across Utah and \$41.5 million in labor income. Each direct Cambia job supported 1.8 additional jobs in the state.

Cambia and its employees gave \$755,809 to 107 local nonprofits and charities in Utah during 2016. Beyond direct expenditures, 110 of Cambia's employees provided 813 hours of volunteer service.
